•	\$454M	Total value of all boats sold in Washington for 2013 calendar year
•	\$21.5M	Most expensive boat in the 2014 show
•	317,624	Square feet of on-the-water space to explore
•	51,684	Attendance at 2014 Seattle Boat Show
•	44,000	\$ Amount of the most expensive boat ever given away at the show, a 2007 Chris Craft.
•	30,000	Distance (in feet) if all boats in the show were lined up end to end.
•	12,000	Average value (in dollars) of a boat sold in Washington in 2013
•	7,428	Miles travelled by attendee who came from Dubai
•	3,600	Linear feet of red carpet used at CenturyLink Field Event Center.
•	1947	The year the first Seattle Boat Show was held
•	444	Number of exhibitors at the show in 2014
•	225	Number of hours of free seminars at the show
•	148	Number of boat brands in the 2014 show
•	130	Largest boat in the 2014 show (measured in feet). Also the most expensive boat in the show.
•	31	Number of states where e-ticket buyers traveled from in 2014 (plus 6 Canadian provinces)
